Millions of Dollars In Capital Improvements

The past several months have brought a dramatic advance in the technology used in Parkview's Imaging Department. Parkview now boasts state-of-the-art CT and 4-D ultrasound as well as nuclear medicine, mammography and bone density systems. A new era was born in April 2007 when Parkview re-introduced Labor & Delivery services to their lineup with newly remodeled spacious and comfortable birthing suites decked out with the latest equipment. The Mary Gibbs Jones Rehabilitation Center was also relocated and remodeled, a project that opened in July 2007. Responding to the needs of the community, April 2008 ushered in a much-anticipated service line: inpatient senior care services. This new unit offers nine patient beds and space for group therapy and activities.

Contributing To Our Local Tax Base

Last year, Parkview Regional Hospital paid \$304,715 in property taxes, and \$14,850 in sales taxes.

Helping Those In Need

In the past year, Parkview Regional Hospital has provided over \$10 million in uncompensated care, much of it for those lacking sufficient financial resources. This continues to be an important mission of the hospital. In addition, Parkview made donations to local causes and events in the amount of \$19,000.

Adding New Physicians

Dr. Robert Stockburger, a board-certified OB-GYN, came to Mexia in early 2007 to open the Parkview Women's Health Center. August 2007 saw the addition of Dr. Jerry Simmons, a family medicine physician who joined the Parkview Rural Health Clinic. The Parkview Rural Health Clinic also added certified family nurse practitioner Nicole Collatos to its provider family in 2007. May 2008 will see the addition of Dr. Phillip Jones, a board-certified general surgeon, to the active medical staff.
