More than \$650,000 in capital improvements

Over the past year, Parkview proudly added a technologically advanced digital mammography system to its repertoire of high-tech equipment in the Radiology Department. Now, the department boasts 3D/4D ultrasound, nuclear medicine, 16-slice CT, 1.5 MRI, bone density and vascular echocardiography. Additionally, several patient rooms were remodeled with all-new flooring, fixtures and décor. Coming soon, the front lobby will be remodeled to enhance the patient experience. Further, we anticipate the addition of electronic medical records in the coming year.

In 2010, we invested \$654,567 in our facility which, in addition to the above, included technology replacement, information technology additions/updates, and important facility upkeep and maintenance.

Contributing to our local tax base

Last year, Parkview Regional Hospital paid more than \$264,000 in taxes that help support our city, county and state. This included sales taxes as well as property taxes. These dollars help support

local schools, the development of roads, the recruitment of business and industry, and other vital community services.

Helping those in need

Parkview Regional Hospital provided over \$45.9 million in uncompensated care last year, which included the amounts not covered by Medicare and Medicaid. This amount includes \$8.8 million for charity care and bad debt, incurred as we served many people without the financial resources to pay for basic health services.

Adding new physicians

We were proud to introduce Dr. Kody Yerger to our medical staff last fall. Dr. Yerger is a family medicine physician who completed his residency training at John Peter Smith Hospital in Ft. Worth and medical school at the University of Texas Medical School at Houston. He sees patients in the Rural Health Clinic in Mexia.

With an annual payroll of more than \$13.7 million and nearly 250 employees, Parkview Regional Hospital is one of the largest employers in the region. This means that our staff and their families attend many of the same schools, shop at the same grocery stores, and volunteer their time and resources for the same organizations as you do.
